
We look forward to doing all this & more again in 2018 so please


The Habits of the Inhabitants of the Habitat Tree

One program that makes this unique space all the more special to us is the **Urban Habitats Program** which saw the creation of the **Urban Habitat Tree** just outside the **StirrUp Gallery Space** where we run our Holiday Workshop Programs.

So, in the **SPRING Holidays** we dedicated a whole Drawing Workshop to this wonderful resource.

We created a drawing to celebrate the daily rituals and social lives of the birds of the Tree and ate our afternoon tea under it's shade learning about the history and importance of urban habitats as Rosy Porter (ARCCO's Environment Program Co-ordinator) filled our minds with lots of fascinating facts & interesting information. What a beautiful visual testament we made to our appreciation of the importance of this tree & its fine feathered friends.





Barbara used lots of different materials to make her sculptures, like stone and marble, wood and bronze.

This book invites us to walk through an Art Gallery with a family who feel a bit nervous about what to expect but walk away realising visiting an Art Gallery (Museum or Exhibition) can change a life forever! On the way home on the train they start playing a drawing game ... "[t]he first person draws a shape—any shape, it's not supposed to be anything, just a shape. The next person has to change it into something." We fully recommend reading this book, visiting an Art Gallery, Museum or Exhibition & playing this game a lot over the Summer Holidays.


Alphabetical Sydney


